Welcome to St Matthew's Parish Church

Deuteronomy presents Moses as the ideal prophet. The first reading foretells the coming of a prophet who will speak God's word to the people. The prophet can never speak on his own authority, but speaks on behalf of God.

The Jews believed that God would raise up in the last days a prophet like Moses. The early Christians regarded Jesus as the awaited prophet. His teaching was given with authority and confirmed by miracles, as we see in today's gospel, the sign that God was in him.

The two main components of Jesus' ministry were teaching and healing. Jesus teaches and acts with divine power and authority. Mark illustrates the authority of Jesus in terms of his teaching, exorcism, and healing.

But here the emphasis is on his teaching. Jesus speaks with prophetic authority in a manner very different from the traditionalism of the scribes, something that made a deep impression on the ordinary people.

It is our custom to spend some time in quiet preparation before the liturgy begins, and save further conversation until we meet socially for refreshments afterwards. The following reflection, based on today's themes, may be found helpful:

Prayer / Reflection

Ideally words and deeds should always go together. The weakness of a lot of words arises from the fact that they are not preceded by, or accompanied by, or followed by corresponding deeds. Lord, grant that what we say with our lips, we may believe with our hearts, and practice with our lives.


