Welcome to St Matthew's Parish Church

Safeguarding St Matthew's is committed to providing a safe environment for all who come. If you have any concerns, please speak with one of our welcomers or a churchwarden who may be identified by their lanyard. They will be happy to help you.

Live streaming Please note that this service is being streamed. You may sit where you wish. If, however, you prefer not to be seen online, please sit in a side aisle. The administration of Holy Communion will not be shown.

GDPR Some of St Matthew's services (most Sunday mornings and some special services) are live-streamed or recorded for those who cannot attend church in person. Under GDPR, the church must gain the consent of anyone whose image may be captured, as this constitutes collection of "personal data". This includes clergy, readers/intercessors, musicians and congregation. Whilst every attempt is made not to capture the faces of members of the congregation, this may occasionally happen if people turn around or move around the church during the service. The exception is communion, when the congregation is not filmed. The side aisles and back of the nave are so far as possible film-free areas not covered by the camera. Any-one whose personal data is collected must give their consent. Consent forms are available both in church and on the website. The full policy can be read on our parish website or on the noticeboards in church.

Toilet and baby changing facilities may be found at the base of the church tower. There is also a small servery.

For younger children In the north aisle (nearest to Collingwood Road), a carpeted area equipped with age-specific Christian resources is provided. Please feel free to make use of these facilities.

¶ 132nd Dedication Festival

According to ancient custom church buildings are dedicated to the service of God by act of solemn consecration in the course of a special ceremony at which a bishop presides. Henry VIII, in 1536, ordered that 'the Feast of Dedication should be kept throughout this realm' of England on the first Sunday in October, an injunction still followed to this day if the date of consecration is not known.

The Parish Church of St Matthew, Northampton was, however, consecrated and dedicated to the glory of God on St Matthew's Day, Thursday 21st September 1893, by the Bishop of Peterborough, The Right Reverend Mandell Creighton. He also instituted The Reverend John Rowden Hussey as first Vicar.

Three years before, a local brewer, Pickering Phipps II 1827-1890, died. He had twice been Mayor of Northampton between 1860 and 1866, and twice an MP. Mr Phipps had already indicated that he would give land for the erection of a church and vicarage in the new estate known as Phippsville. His four daughters and only son (of the same name, Pickering Phipps III, 1861-1937) decided to carry out their father's wishes, and to erect a great church in his memory. Their munificence has been of enduring benefit not only to the people of Northampton, but also to the wider Church.

This anniversary of the dedicated church building reminds us that it is *Domus Ecclesiae*, the 'House of the Church', the house in which God's pilgrim people gather. God's Church is the community of the baptised. We are the people of God, the body of Christ, called to serve him by living and proclaiming the Good News of Jesus Christ in the world. We are called to be 'living stones', and as such nurture and grow his kingdom on earth as it is in heaven.
