Safeguarding St Matthew's is committed to providing a safe environment for all who come. If you have any concerns, please speak with one of our welcomers or a churchwarden who may be identified by their lanyard. They will be happy to help you.

Live streaming Please note that this service is being streamed. You may sit where you wish. If, however, you prefer not to be seen online, please sit in a side aisle. The administration of Holy Communion will not be shown.

GDPR Some of St Matthew's services (most Sunday mornings and some special services) are live-streamed or recorded for those who cannot attend church in person. Under GDPR, the church must gain the consent of anyone whose image may be captured, as this constitutes collection of "personal data". This includes clergy, readers/intercessors, musicians and congregation. Whilst every attempt is made not to capture the faces of members of the congregation, this may occasionally happen if people turn around or move around the church during the service. The exception is communion, when the congregation is not filmed. The side aisles and back of the nave are so far as possible film-free areas not covered by the camera. Anyone whose personal data is collected must give their consent. Consent forms are available both in church and on the website. The full policy can be read on our parish website or on the noticeboards in church.

Toilet and baby changing facilities may be found at the base of the church tower. There is also a small servery.

For younger children In the north aisle (nearest to Collingwood Road), a carpeted area equipped with age-specific Christian resources is provided. Please feel free to make use of these facilities.

The Third Sunday of Advent - Gaudete Sunday

Good morning and welcome to our Parish Mass on The Third Sunday of Advent, traditionally known as *Gaudete Sunday*. Today the Church invites us to pause amid the somber, watchful tone of Advent and to rejoice - *Gaudete!* - for the Lord is near. The rose-coloured vestments and candle of the Advent Wreath symbolize this lifting of spirit, a gentle reminder that even in seasons of waiting, joy is already breaking through.

Our readings speak beautifully to this theme of hope fulfilled. From the prophet Isaiah we hear a vision of the desert blooming, the weak strengthened, and the redeemed returning home with singing. It is an image of God's transformative promise - a world healed, renewed, and flooded with divine joy.

In the Gospel according to Matthew, John the Baptist, waiting in prison, sends his disciples to Jesus with a question: "Are you the one who is to come?" Jesus responds not with titles but with signs - the blind see, the lame walk, the poor receive good news. These are the very promises Isaiah foretold, now coming to life in Christ.

As we gather today, may this liturgy deepen our joy and strengthen our hope. Whether we come with hearts light or heavily burdened, God meets us here with the assurance that his saving work has already begun, and that his coming is near.

Let us rejoice, then, as we continue our Advent journey toward the light of Christ.

It is our custom to spend some time in quiet preparation before the liturgy begins, and save further conversation until we meet socially for refreshments afterwards. The following prayer, based on today's themes, may be found helpful:
